

Fool Hollow Lake Recreation Area



Located in the Apache-Sitgreaves National Forest, Fool Hollow Lake Recreation Area opened in 1994.

With year-round camping, fishing, picnicking, boating and wildlife viewing, Fool Hollow Lake Recreation Area is one of the most popular state parks! Camp among the 100-foot pine trees at 6300 feet in elevation and watch blue herons fishing the quiet lake. For RV enthusiasts, you will find 92 hookup sites and 31 non-hookup sites.

If fishing is on your agenda, Show Low Creek flows into Fool Hollow Lake, provides for a variety of fish species. A valid fishing license is required - Anglers 10 years and older.

Trails or Wildlife Viewing more your style? White Mountain Trail System consists of 11 loops trails offering over 200 miles of hiking! Keep your eyes open to see Squirrel, Gopher, Skunk, Raccoon, Beaver and Muskrat. Bald Eagles visit in Winters and Ospreys fish the lake in Summer.

Stay alert as you may find poisonous snakes and insects.

There are five day-use ramadas available for your event. Each Ramada has picnic tables, a large charcoal grill, a serving table, electricity, a horseshoe pit and restrooms. Each with a 150 person maximum except the Bluebird 100 person maximum. Two playgrounds are centrally located.

Dispersed Camping



You may camp outside of developed campgrounds anywhere on the Forest at no charge. Potable water, toilets, and other amenities are not generally available. If you choose to camp outside developed areas, be sure to bring adequate water or be prepared to purify any water source before drinking. No permits are required to camp in Wilderness areas.

Here are directions to three dispersed camping sites that are accessible with an RV or passenger vehicle in dry weather.

1. From the Lakeside Forest Service office go south on AZ 260 5 miles. Turn left on Bucksprings Rd. Go 1 mile then turn left on Sky Hi Rd. (FS 182). Go 2 miles then turn right on FS 185. Go 0.4 miles and turn right on dirt road. Camping available anywhere in the next 0.5 miles.
2. From the Lakeside Forest Service office go south on AZ 260 5 miles. Turn left on Bucksprings Rd. Go 2 miles then turn left on Sky Hi Rd. FS 182 (FS 182). Turn left on FS 187. There are several options in the next mile by turning right on dirt roads and camping less than 0.5 miles off FS 187.
3. From Lakeside Forest Service Office go south 1/4 mile. Turn left on Porter Mountain Rd. Go 2.2 miles and turn right to stay on Porter Mountain Rd. Go to milepost 4. Turn right over the cattle guard. Bear right and follow the dirt road. Camping is available anywhere in the next 0.5 miles.

Come and enjoy camping on 2 million acres of forest service land with over 30 lakes and 1,000 miles of rivers and streams!

Show Low Lake

In the heart of the White Mountains! Experience all the outdoor fun of camping.

Smelling the pine trees, the breeze coming off the lake or the warmth from the campfire as you bring an end to the day, you will enjoy Show Low Lake campground.

Show Low Lake campground is at an Elevation of 6,500 feet and right next to a stunning 100 acre lake. Grounds are open year round and offer 75 camp sites, some with hookups as well as a dump station, restroom and seasonal shower facility.

Campsites include a BBQ grill, fire rings and a table. Group campsites are also available. For day use you will find picnic ramadas and a playground.

Show Low Lake is great for fishing and is the best in the state for Walleyed Pike! With up to 50 foot depths, it's perfect for beginners or more advanced anglers. A valid fishing license and trout stamp is required - 10 years and older.

Boating is permitted on the lake in electric boats or gas engine boats with a maximum of 10 horsepower.

Los Burros Campground

Los Burros Campground; at 7900 feet elevation you will find a beautiful meadow outlined by aspen trees scattered throughout the area.

Enjoy 10 rustic campsites, each with a picnic table and a fire ring. Campground has vaulted toilets but no showers or drinking water.

Come and enjoy hiking, horseback riding and picnicking. The Los Burros Trail #631 is one of the finest in the White Mountains.

14 day stay limit. No fee. Open 5/1 to 10/31.

From the Lakeside Forest Service Office go south 10.7 miles to McNary, AZ. Turn left (sign says to Vernon) on FS Rd. 224. Go 7 miles to Los Burros Campground (sign on right). Turn right.
