MINUTES OF TRACKS GENERAL MEETING June 1, 2019
at Woodland Lake Park Ramada #2

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 PM by Jim Snitzer. There were about 31 people in attendance. Guests present were Dave and Paula Sanders from Texas who have been RVing for 7 years.

Minutes of the previous General Meeting were reviewed. A motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Jerry Good, seconded by Linda Klingler, and approved by members present.

Announcements:

1. Ron Miller, Trail Steward Coordinator, announced that there are still two trails needing stewards.
2. Joan Patrick needs one more Trailhead Adopter. Los Caballos has been adopted by Christine Brady.
3. Arlene Nelson has new TRACKS t-shirts for sale for \$20 each. She has only long sleeves now but short sleeves will be available by next month as well as hats. She displayed the different colors.
4. Linda Klingler asked about license plate covers. More research is needed as to whether we use plastic or metal with metal being more expensive.
5. Lynn Krigbaum thanked everyone who came to the Walk for the Woods this year and contributed in various ways. Lynn has been at Woodland Lake many times to educate visitors about the importance and need for buying Woodland Lake Park.
6. Tom Jernigan announced raffle tickets for sale for a non-tethered balloon ride at the end of June.
7. Jerry Good announced that the trail crew will meet at Honda Monday, June 3, and leave from there by 7:30 AM to work on Los Burros.
8. Jim Snitzer explained to the members that the Town of Pinetop-Lakeside has a budget that sets aside a "place holder" for buying Woodland Lake Park. They don't have the funds yet, but once that \$1,635,000 is secured the Town will purchase it. Monies that go to Save Our Park is obtained in various fund raising events.
9. Jim also spoke of the recycling area the Town is building near Public Works off Woodland Rd. It should be up and running by July 1. He also mentioned an independent company named Recyclops will come to private residences for a fee and would have to provide containers for them.
10. New owners of Cycle Mania are hoping to extend mountain bike trails. Since one of the owners is a teacher at Blue Ridge, she has provided 35 mountain bikes for some students and teaching bike maintenance.
11. Jim spoke of the bike gate behind the Nature Center and encourages people to use it and provide comments.
12. TRACKS may commit to helping finance signs along Hwy 260 with permission from the Forest Service and ADOT. The signs will alert people about access to trails. Jim also talked about the Ice Cave Trail. This trail has been destroyed by horses and is not useable by hikers. That trail is no longer TRACKS'

responsibility. The Forest Service will be working with the stables nearby to maintain it.

13. Jim told members that TRACKS will need a replacement for Betty Zink's position in maintaining the TRACKS website. Also, Tim Strand needs help with editing the TRACKS Newsletter. Articles that are submitted should be already written and screen sized.
14. Lynn Krigbaum has extra W4W t-shirts at \$10 each. Ann Groebner designed the shirts and even paid for the ink used in the printing.

Next General Meeting will be July 13 at 8:00 AM – a breakfast potluck at Woodland Lake Park.
